## Welcome and Opening Plenary: "Centering Humanity in the Science of Injury Prevention"

The Opening Plenary sets the tone for an inspiring and impactful conference, bringing together leaders, partners, and attendees to reflect, celebrate, and look ahead. Attendees will hear from the outgoing president during the President's Address, reflecting on the past year's achievements, challenges, and lessons learned across the field. This will be followed by the presentation of the President's Award, honoring an individual whose contributions have made a significant and lasting impact on injury and violence research and prevention.

The plenary culminates with a dynamic opening keynote from a distinguished speaker, offering fresh insights and a compelling call to action. A moderated Q&A session will follow, providing an opportunity for attendees to engage directly, ask questions, and deepen the conversation. Together, this session celebrates leadership, recognizes excellence, and energizes participants for the days ahead.

The opening keynote will be presented by Dr. Megan L. Ranney -- an emergency physician, researcher, and leading advocate for innovative approaches to public health. She is the Dean of the Yale School of Public Health, the C.-E. A. Winslow Professor of Public Health, and a Professor of Emergency Medicine at Yale University. Dr. Ranney is the first Dean to lead YSPH since it became a fully independent graduate institution in 2024, with a new strategic vision of linking science and society, making public health foundational to communities everywhere.

Dr. Ranney's career has been driven by her front-row seat to preventable public health crises, from her formative years in the Peace Corps to her 20+ years as a practicing emergency medicine physician. Whether addressing motor vehicle injuries and firearm violence, HIV and COVID-19, or the importance of healthcare access, her first-hand experiences have fueled her commitment to high-quality science and making sure the science is used and understood by communities across the globe.

## Global Firearm Violence Research Special Interest Group

Firearm related harm continues to be a major public health burden in the United States. This burden is also global in scope and nature. There is an estimated 250,000 firearm related deaths each year, tens of thousands more are injured and disabled. Six countries, all in the Americas account for over half of these deaths: US, Mexico, Guatemala, Colombia, Venezuela, and Brazil. A recent study revealed that bullets are the leading cause of death of youth in the United States, Mexico, Colombia, and Brazil. In the United States, gun violence death rates vary between states by a factor of 7! Gun violence death rates among nations have a similar “range” of rates.

This inaugural meeting facilitated by Dr. Stephen Hargarten will launch the Firearm Violence Research Special Interest Group (SIG), a multidisciplinary forum designed to connect researchers, clinicians, practitioners, and policy scholars working to prevent firearm-related harm and improve outcomes for those affected. The SIG will emphasize both domestic and global perspectives, recognizing that cross-country collaboration offers important opportunities to advance methods, generate new insights, and translate evidence into effective programs and policies.
